To protect yourself from internet scammers, always be cautious when sharing personal information online and verify the legitimacy of websites, emails, and messages before clicking on links or providing sensitive data. Use strong, unique passwords for different accounts and enable two-factor authentication whenever possible. Be skeptical of unsolicited offers, prize notifications, or urgent requests for money, especially from unknown sources. Avoid downloading attachments or software from untrusted emails and regularly update your devices and security software to protect against malware. If something seems too good to be true, it probably is—stay vigilant and trust your instincts.

Remember that no one from the NFMS will ever ask for your financial information and Judi Allsion wants me to remind all of you that funds within the federation are sent the old fashion way, on paper via the mail.

Now... speaking of financial responsibility, we are again in search of a Treasurer. This is such a key position that I would like everyone to put on their thinking caps and come up with someone who might fill this void.

2025 NFMS Mid Year Meeting Saturday April 26, 2025

The NFMS will hold a Mid-Year meeting in conjunction with the 28th Annual Show of the Lakeside Gem & Mineral Club in Kennewick, WA. The Mid-Year Meeting will be held from 1:00 - 3:00 pm on Saturday April 26 in Building #16 at the Benton County Fairgrounds, 1500 S. Oak Street. The Lakeside Show is being held in the adjacent Building #2, a short walk from Building #16.

Registration will start at **12:30 PM**. There will be a food vendor available for lunch and dinner that day in conjunction with the ongoing Show. Hours for the Show on Saturday are from 10 AM to 5 PM and on Sunday from 10 AM to 4 PM.

RV camping is available at the Fairgrounds with electricity and water available for \$10/night. If you plan to use these facilities please send an email to Larry Hulstrom at rockhound132@charter.net prior to April 12 indicating date of arrival and duration of stay so an accurate count can be kept and space can be planned. Payment will be collected upon arrival at the Fairgrounds. There are a number of motels throughout the immediate area in Kennewick. Information about a few of these has been provided below.

The members of the Lakeside Gem and Mineral Club would like extend a warm invitation to join us for the NFMS Mid Year meeting and encourage you to stay over to attend our annual show. In addition to 19 dealers, we will have about 40 displays, a fluorescent mineral display, a silent auction, a Kid's Corner, demonstrations, and door prizes. On Sunday morning from 8 AM to noon there will also be tailgating across from the show building for anyone interested. Come join your fellow rockhounds for a weekend of fun and fellowship and take in the sites that the area has to offer.

Directions to the Mid Year Meeting in Kennewick, Washington at the Benton County Fairgrounds on April 26, 2025

Coming into the Tri-Cities area from the south on Highway 395 turn right (east) onto 10th Ave (the third stop light coming into town). Follow this about 3 miles. The fairgrounds will be visible on the right side just past and behind a park. Once at the Fairgrounds gate you will see the Show building to the right in Building #2. RV camping will be available near that building or in an adjacent area. Walk over to the show to obtain more specific directions for parking. Ask for the RV Camping Coordinator. The Mid Year Meeting will be held in Building #16 which is across the way from Building #2.

From anywhere else coming into Kennewick it would be best to find your way to Highway 395 and take the turn east onto 10th Avenue and then follow it down to the Fairgrounds.

Chrysocolla, a vibrant copper-bearing mineral, is highly sought after by collectors for its striking blue and green hues. Often found in botryoidal, massive, or fibrous forms rather than distinct crystals, chrysocolla is commonly associated with other copper minerals such as malachite, azurite, and turquoise. Major sources of high-quality specimens include copper mines in Arizona, Peru, and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Collectors prize chrysocolla for its rich coloration and unique formations, particularly when it occurs in polished nodules or as an inclusion within quartz, creating the stunning "gem silica" variety.

Historically, chrysocolla has been recognized for its use in pigments and decorative carvings. Ancient civilizations, including the Egyptians and Greeks, ground it into powders for use in art and cosmetics. Despite its softness compared to other minerals, chrysocolla remains popular in lapidary work, often stabilized with quartz or resin to enhance its durability for jewelry. Its formation within copper deposits gives it an interesting geological background, making it an appealing specimen for both mineral enthusiasts and geologists.

For collectors, chrysocolla's variety in form and color offers endless appeal. While some specimens display vibrant sky-blue hues, others blend seamlessly with malachite's deep green or azurite's royal blue, creating striking mineral combinations. Because of its relative softness, proper handling and storage are essential to preserving its beauty. Whether displayed as raw specimens, polished cabochons, or as part of a larger copper mineral collection, chrysocolla remains a favorite for those who appreciate both color and geological diversity.
